ABOUT THE BOOK

This encyclopedia provides comprehensive coverage of current developments in public policy and public administration as fields of study and government practice in the global South. It contains distinct empirical, methodological, and theoretical essays on practical and normative transformations and underlying trajectories that have emerged in Asian, Latin American, and African public policy and administration in recent decades. It puts together a unique scholarship, bringing together all generations of scholars from different regions in the Global South to explore and examine public policy, public administration, and governance dynamics in developing countries. The focus is mainly on those countries still dealing with development and democratisation challenges or those states that are yet to overcome colonial legacies. This encyclopedia is a multi-volume series and the first of its kind to be edited by some of the most established academics and researchers from the Global South. It publishes research briefs and reports by practitioners, researchers, academics, and conceptual essays and discussions that broadly handle the Global South's development issues and how these relate to policy, administration, governance, and politics within and across regions.

TAYARISHA SECTIONS:

The Tayarisha Centre is proud to be editing the following sections of the Encyclopaedia and invites abstracts that relate to them:

1. **Artificial Intelligence (AI)** – AI has the potential to transform the way governments and public institutions operate. This section will focus on articulating, documenting, analysing the spectrum of implications (opportunities, threats, etc.) of AI for public policy and administration, including for transformations in or through Automation (efficiencies and cost savings, but also changes in the world of work), Improved decision-making, Service delivery, Regulation and governance (including increased transparency and accountability), and Ethical and privacy considerations.
2. **Digital Governance** (or Digital age Governance) - focusing on government's anticipatory capabilities, and transformation through digitalisation (of policy, regulation, service delivery, etc.)

3. **Civic Tech Innovation** - focusing on government-civic interactions in ‘the use of digital technologies in connecting government and citizens, in public participation, in transparency and accountability, and in delivering public services’ (civictech.africa)
4. **Gov-Tech Innovation** – focusing on government-non-government interactions and ecosystems for addressing public sector challenges and improving government services through open innovation approaches.

The following contribution types are ultimately going to be accepted for the Project:

- A. **Standard submissions** (Full paper): Between 6500-10000 words (theoretical and empirical papers)
- B. **Short essays**: Between 3500 – 6000 words
- C. **Conceptual papers**: Between 3500 – 4000 words
